once you have applied and received a code please bring that into nursery along with your NI number and child's passport, Birth Certificate or Red book. Please return your completed declaration form as soon as possible – Sent out on Tapestry 26th February.

Please let us know if you have any questions. If you have already applied, please make sure you revalidate before the end of March as you cannot access funding for the first time if it is over three months since you initially applied!!

If you currently have 30 hours funding you need to revalidate your current code with HMRC to continue to get the funding from April.

Nursery News

Babies - February was a very messy month in the baby room!! Shaving foam was a favourite with added paint, this was used to decorate the children, the floor, the toys and some walls - a great time was had by all! The children have also made marks in flour, some using their hands and vehicles, others their whole selves. The children looked like ghosts at the end of the activity!! We have explored different sounds using musical instruments and using words loud, quiet, and soft to describe what we could hear, this also led to some interesting dance moves and very loud singing! We have enjoyed getting out and about in our local community and visited the river, walking along the path looking for leaves and sticks. The children continue to show great interest in vehicles with to play with and to spot on our walks. Soft play has been very popular, particularly crawling through our tunnel and 'surprising' everyone when they pop out of the end.





Home Learning

Like all the best learning experiences in early childhood, music activities simultaneously promote development in multiple domains. Singing a lullaby while rocking a baby stimulates early language development, promotes attachment, and supports an infant's growing spatial awareness as the child experiences their body moving in space. Music, because it is so often shared with others in singing, dancing, and playing instruments together, is by its very nature a social experience. Our children love to listen to different genres of music as well as their

favourites songs! They also love to explore sound with the different instruments, as well as pots and pans! You can make a variety of shakers using empty bottles and by adding things such as rice, dried peas, buttons etc the children hear different sounds. What music does your child enjoy, favourite songs – these don't have to be children's songs either!! Let us know so we can share them at nursery – I feel a disco coming on!!

Toddlers - Under 2's

We have enjoyed spending time outside with the children as the weather has improved. We have been developing our gross motor skills, running and jumping and creating balancing opportunities for the children to explore. Shapes have been a big spark for the children and they have been able to recognise and name circles, squares and triangles and make arrangements and patterns with them, we have extended this with lots of puzzles which they have really enjoyed. We introduced the Insets for Design to the children, this is a Montessori activity to develop hand/eye co-ordination and mark making, the children had a great time using these with the help of staff - the triangle was a particular favourite. We took this spark outside too with shapes on a larger scale!! Bouncing balls along the floor to create splashes and bubbles was great fun! The children also explored shape and colour using our large construction blocks and duplo - so much conversation about what they were building and the colours of the resources.

One of the most important benefits of toddlers learning about shapes is that it helps them develop early literacy and numeracy shills. The shapes that we see all around us in our everyday lives are the same shapes that make up the letters and numbers in our alphabet and number system! What shape activities does your child enjoy at home? When we are out and about we also discuss the shapes we see in the environment – the children love to look for a given shape. Do they have a favourite puzzle? Please send a photo of them with them so we can share these with their friends.

Toddlers - Over 2's

To extend our Chinese New Year celebrations we have looked further at China. This involved making our own noodles with Dawn's help and trying to use chopsticks to transfer noodles from one pot to another. We looked at the flag of China and a world map to see where the country is in relation to us and saw that it is much bigger and on the continent of Asia. We looked at Chinese numbers and had a go painting them using water colours and fine paint brushes - such concentration | Outside the children worked together to build the Great Wall of China. We have been further afield too and the children were excited to spot some early spring flowers and spent a long time looking at the shape of their petals and the colour - lots of purple ones were spotted!!

When we are out and about the children love to have something specific to look for, this month it has been flowers, but it could be shapes, vehicles, animals, or fruit and veg in the shop. These 'treasure hunts' encourage communication observational skills and are great fun! These activities can also be used on car journeys – I am sure you do this. What do your children like to look for, please let us know and we can create some spotter sheets for the different things - our children love a clipboard!!

Pre school

Chinese New Year was also celebrated in Pre school and we were delighted to have Evelyn's parents come and join us. They explained to the children how they decorate their home for the celebrations, the children listened really well and went on to make their own Chinese lantern decoration to take home. The children particularly enjoyed performing a dragon dance and were fascinated by 'The Great Race' story which created the zodiac, they were all eager to know what animal they were. For Valentines Day we talked about emotions and lots of activities and discussions were sparked by the book 'The Colour Monster'. The children talked about the people we love and how we feel when we are with those people. This also led to discussions about other emotions we may have. Colour mixing was also sparked from the book and the children experimented with two primary colours and made predictions about what colour they would make when mixed together and compared the shades they had made. Jewellery has also been a big spark! So many bracelets and necklaces have been made and threading skills have improved no end and the children have gone from needing help to thread to be able to do this independently. Outdoors the children have been helping to tidy the garden and Yard, lots of sweeping and collecting leaves and making both

Threading can be a challenging activity that takes a while for children to master and is very much dependent on their maturity and fine motor development. Our children have enjoyed threading heart shaped pasta but there are so many things you could use:- set of plastic or wooden beads and string, thread macaroni onto a string, large buttons or spools onto a string, pierce a hole into flowers or leaves and make a nature necklace, thread cereal loops to make an edible necklace - threading onto dried spaghetti takes some skill!! Let us know if you have a go at any of these at home!

If antibiotics are being used, we kindly as that you keep your child away from nursery for the first 48 hrs following initial medication.
