<u>Babies</u> - this month the babies have enjoyed lots of sensory play using various items. A favourite was dried porridge oats with added dinosaurs!!



The children moved the models around and encouraged them to 'eat', they made marks in the oats as they stamped their feet. The children also helped to colour rice using the primary colours and once dry, vehicles were added to make marks and move the rice around The children decided to add themselves to the mix and had a great time mark making on a much bigger and messier scale!! Farms and farm animals continue to be popular sparks and we have created interactive trays with the animals and tractors to increase the children's vocabulary, we have also loved singing 'Old MacDonald Had a Farm' to practice the names and sounds! Home Learning

Messy play is all about learning through experience. It involves using all five senses to explore how things feel, smell and taste, as well as what they look and sound like when we interact with them. You can give your child the freedom to use messy play materials in whatever way they like to help encourage them to learn independently.

Messy play can also really aid your child's physical development. Through play, they will be developing things like fine and gross motor skills, and handeye coordination.

Toddlers - Under 2's

Spring has definitely sprung in our room. The children have been so excited on our recent walks spotting signs that Spring has arrived. This has provided lots of opportunity for new language, names of flowers, colours and where they were found - blossom was a particular favourite when it was spotted!! This also led to lots of running and jumping trying to reach the lower branches. Back at nursery the children were keen to make their own flowers and interpretations of blossom, they also explored mark making with actual flowers! Farm animals continue to be of interest to the children and we have seen some lovely co-operative play sharing the animals. We have talked about where the animals live and the children are very good at making the noises!! Role play has been great fun this month, from bakeries to shopping this has give the children lots of opportunities to play together, explore new language and talk about their lokes and dislikes - cake was definitely popular!

We witness role play daily; the majority of the scenarios are rooted in children's own experiences. Role play enables them to enact these experiences in a context that gives them control of the play scenario. This type of play helps children to address emotional and social issues that other types of play may not facilitate. It provides tools for learning about resolution of conflict and

opportunities to address anxieties that may lie buried in the subconscious. Shops, cafes and tea parties are the most popular at nursery and the children love to use natural and real objects. Toddlers - Over 2's

The children have also enjoyed exploring Spring on walks to the park and along the riverbank. At nursery the children enjoyed exploring flowers, looking at and naming the different parts, arranging mark making and creating still life works of art. As we celebrated St Partick's Day Ireland was our country of the month. We explored the colours of the flag, creating our own by mixing prime colours to match them. We also found a delicious recipe for potato scones, leaving out the salt but adding some herbs. Cleaning has been a great spark this month! The children have cared for environment by washing tables, chairs, wellies, cupboard doors, the floor and frankly anything they came across! They have used cloths and dustpans and brushes with increasing control. They have also shown increasing control with pouring and transferring activities refining their skills beautifully. The children really enjoyed being scientists during British Science week - a favourite experiment being what would make bubbles when added to water - including toothpaste! This led to all sorts of discussions about changes and floating and sinking.


Pre school

Potato Scones

We used the recipe from BBC Good Food website

Ingredients

- 450g (1lb) Floury potatoes, peeled and cooked
- Pinch of herbs
- 2oz butter
- 4oz self raising flour

Method

Mash potatoes, add herbs and butter and flour to give a stiff mixture.

Turn out onto floured surface, knead lightly and roll out to a thickness of 1cm (1/2inch).

Cut into shapes and cook on a hot greased griddle for 4-5 min on each side.
