# Baby room

Preschool have enjoyed being outside in the sunshine and talking about the animals they find outside. They found a newt outdoors and brought it in to look at and learn about. They talked about its home and how we can care for the environment and animals.

**Ingredients** 

Pitta breads (1 pitta per child)
Grated cheese Yellow peppers
Courgette Passata
Garden peas Mixed herbs
Method

Roast the veg until cooked through and set aside to cool. When cooled, chop the veg into small chunks and

mix together with the grated cheese and herbs.

Spread a spoonful of passata on each pitta bread and finish by adding the vegetable mixture on top.

Cook in the oven for 10 mins or until cheese is completely melted.
